The Lime Creek Nature Center Foundation is an incorporated non-profit organization.

Each Foundation Board member must maintain a current Lime Creek Nature Center membership.

A single term on the Foundation Board is three years. Members can serve two consecutive terms.

Meetings are held the first Tuesday of each month at the nature center.



Here is the difference in what we do!

The mission of the Lime Creek Nature Center is to develop an awareness and appreciation of our natural world through conservation and education.

Funding for the education program, internships, and displays is supported by memberships, grants, and donations.

The Foundation Board is made of 11-21 volunteers who serve as advisors, support, and advocates.

Cerro Gordo County Conservation (CGCC) is responsible for the enhancement and development of natural resources on county owned properties. (including Lime Creek)

CGCC employs 10 full-time staff who manage parks, wildlife areas, roadsides, and the education program/nature center.

Funding for salaries, operations, and capital purchases is supported by tax dollars and grants.

The Conservation Board is 5 residents appointed by the BOS who set policies.
